#### **Basic Instructions:**

- Read the assigned academic articles.
- I encourage you to highlight/underline the article as you read you can do this on a digital or hard copy.
- Determine the main ideas and provide a summary of the author(s)' argument.
- Identify 3 key concepts and define them as the author has defined them.
- Identify 3 key quotes that are meaningful within the framework of the article.
- Create an essential question a question that could be used in class discussion that pertains to a big picture idea from the article.

Page Layout/Format	<ul> <li>Font: Times New Roman</li> <li>Font Size: 12 point</li> <li>Margins: 1 inch top, bottom, left, right</li> <li>1 page total</li> <li>A single space between sections</li> <li>Sections are single spaced</li> </ul>
Header	<ul> <li>Name – Date – Course</li> <li>Article citation in APA – found on course website</li> </ul>
<i>Section 1</i> Synopsis	<ul> <li>Label this section Synopsis in bold</li> <li>1 paragraph (6-10 sentences) summary of the article's main points</li> <li>Paragraph is single spaced</li> </ul>
<i>Section 2</i> Key Concepts	<ul> <li>Label this section Key Concepts in bold</li> <li>Use bullet points to separate each of the 3 key concepts</li> <li>Write the concept – in bold</li> <li>Provide a definition for each concept – definition should be in relation to the article not a dictionary definition.</li> <li>Properly cite all entries whether direct quotes or paraphrased</li> </ul>
<i>Section 3</i> Key Quotes	<ul> <li>Label this section Key Quotes in bold</li> <li>Use bullet points to separate each of the 3 key quotes</li> <li>Use quotation marks to indicate where the quote begins and ends</li> <li>Include a page number where the quote was found</li> <li>Quotes should be significant</li> </ul>
<i>Section 4</i> Essential Question	<ul> <li>Label this section Essential Question in bold</li> <li>1 essential question (you may provide more)</li> <li>Use bullet points to separate the questions</li> <li>Reflects a big picture idea</li> </ul>
Submission	<ul> <li>Upload file to Canvas using the correct assignment link</li> <li>Each assignment will have its own link. Make sure it is the correct one.</li> <li>At exactly one minute after the assignment is due on the due date, the assignment link will be deactivated</li> </ul>
0 given for	<ul> <li>Incorrect document type (ie – not a Word doc)</li> <li>Incorrect file title including a missing word, an extra word, reversed last &amp; first name, incorrect number, etc</li> <li>Late submission</li> <li>Incorrect file submitted</li> <li>Wrote about incorrect reading</li> <li>Assignment is plagiarized in part or whole</li> <li>You attempt to turn in a hard copy version</li> </ul>
